**About:**

The [San Francisco Dog Owners Group](#) calls Fort Funston "the best off-leash area in California, if not the USA.". On the beach and along the bluffs, dogs of all shapes and sizes are having the time of their lives. Admission is free. **Bring:**

Your PWD, a leash, poop bags, collapsible bowl, water, treats and whatever you like to have along with you for an hour or two walk. Dress warmly. On nice days it is cold and windy. On not nice days it is colder and windy.

Per the ranger, dogs must be under verbal control when not on leash. Please bring treats if those help to keep your dog under verbal control.

**Rain or Shine:**

If it is raining hard we will not go

**The Walk Plan:**

The walks range from beginner to intermediate depending on which one you take. Paved paths on the north end are stroller-accessible. Stairway and sandy paths on south end are a little more rugged but head to the beach. When we all arrive we can decide which trail to take.

**Important Information:**

There are two parking lots. The major one to the right as you enter is where the hang gliders and dogs typically go. There are a couple of porta potties and a water fountain. In this area there is a lot of sand and grasses. The trail to the beach is off this parking lot.

The smaller parking area to the left is where the range station and another building associated with research are located. Between these buildings are a couple of picnic tables resting on a grassy area full of foxtails.

**We will meet in the main parking lot. Please arrive NO LATER THAN 9:50 AM so we can start at 10:00 AM.**

**Look for me, Ann Gaskell and Norman, my jet black, curly PWD. Norman will be in his orange collar and I will be wearing a bright orange top.**

**Directions:**

Access to Fort Funston is off HWY 1 in the south bound direction only. It is located just south of the Great HWY and SF ZOO and Lake Merced. To reach the park, located in the southwest corner of San Francisco, follow Highway 35 west on Sloat Boulevard, then south on Skyline Boulevard 1/4-mile south of John Muir Drive to the main entrance.
